(The complete version of regulations amended pursuant to Act No. 89/2012 Coll., Civil Code, adopted by the Convention of Delegates of CzMA JEP on 19 January 2023)

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ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION

CHAPTER ONE

General provisions

§ 1

- (1) Czech Medical Association of Jan Evangelista Purkyně z.s. (hereinafter referred to as “CzMA JEP”) is a self-governing and voluntary association of members – physical entities, namely physicians, pharmacists and other personnel in healthcare and affiliated fields.
- (2) CzMA JEP operates on the territory of the Czech Republic.
- (3) CzMA JEP is a legal entity.
- (4) The registered office of CzMA JEP is in Prague.

§ 2

Mission statement and objectives

- (1) CzMA JEP ensures the development and spreading of the scientific knowledge of medical sciences and affiliated fields and pursues its utilization in public healthcare with special emphasis on preventive activities.
- (2) CzMA JEP engages in increasing the level of its members’ expertise in medical sciences and affiliated fields and in the spreading of health education among citizens.
- (3) CzMA JEP supports research and development activities in healthcare, helps to create conditions for acquainting both experts and laypeople with its own achievements and ensures their application in practice.
- (4) CzMA JEP fully participates in dealing with issues concerning management, organisation and implementation of diagnostic methods, medical and preventive care and related activities.
- (5) CzMA JEP creates conditions for the exchange of information and the development of all forms of co-operation among its members and organisations and institutions of a similar nature in the Czech Republic and abroad. It fully supports the activities of professional societies, territorial associations of physicians and other groups of personnel in healthcare and affiliated fields.
- (6) CzMA JEP ensures compliance with ethical principles in performing the medical occupation.

- (7) CzMA JEP sees to the use of only such diagnostic, preventive and medical methods whose nature and effects are based on currently acknowledged scientific evidence.
- (8) CzMA JEP actively engages in lifetime education of its members and other personnel in healthcare and affiliated fields.

§ 3

Forms of activity

- (1) CzMA JEP organizes specialist discussions and exchange of information among experts of individual fields, co-ordinating their opinions so that they are unified in relation to third persons.
- (2) CzMA JEP organises specialist and educational events in accordance with its mission statements and objectives and encourages the participation of its members in these events in the Czech Republic and abroad.
- (3) Through delegated representatives CzMA JEP takes part in tenders, bankruptcy proceedings, certification, accreditation and similar proceedings.
- (4) CzMA JEP performs professional consulting and expert activities.
- (5) CzMA JEP announces competitions and awards prizes and other honours, especially for excellent achievements in the development of medical sciences and affiliated fields.
- (6) Through delegated representatives CzMA JEP takes part in the activities of the bodies of the Parliament of the Czech Republic, the Ministry of Health of the Czech Republic, chambers of physicians and pharmacists as well as other professional chambers, and other bodies and institutions on various levels involved in healthcare.
- (7) CzMA JEP informs the professional public through its Secretariat.
- (8) CzMA JEP is authorised to perform secondary economic activities (e.g. publishing, leasing of non-residential premises, holding and organizing of national and international educational events, e.g. congresses, symposiums, conferences, lectures, seminars, etc.).
- (9) For the purpose of paid or unpaid activity, CzMA JEP may establish commercial or other legal companies or participate in their business.

CHAPTER TWO

Organisational structure

§ 4

General principles

- (1) The basic organisational units of CzMA JEP are professional societies created on the professional and specialist basis and associations of physicians formed on the territorial principle (hereinafter referred to as “organisational units”).
- (2) Organisational units of CzMA JEP are autonomous in and fully responsible for their professional activities. They are authorised to make their own Articles of Association, Election Regulations, Rules of Procedure and other internal regulations whose principles are in accordance with the Articles of Association, Election Regulations, Rules of Procedure of CzMA JEP and other documents adopted by the congress of delegates or the assembly of organisation unit representatives. In processing their regulations, organizational units may use sample Articles of Association, Election Regulations and Rules of Procedure approved by the Board of Directors of CzMA JEP for organisational units, available on the website of CzMA JEP. The organisational units independently manage the entrusted assets, which they are entitled to handle pursuant to the relevant internal regulations. The regulations of the organisational units must be approved by the Board of Directors of CzMA JEP and must be registered and filed by the Secretariat of CzMA JEP. The regulations come into force and effect on the date of approval by the Board of Directors of CzMA JEP.
- (3) Organisational units of CzMA JEP may be further divided internally and form inferior organisational units – e.g. sections (hereinafter referred to as “sections”). The internal division of organisational units, their structure and documents are approved by the Committee or assembly of the members of the organisational unit. In their activities, sections are obliged to respect the decisions of CzMA JEP bodies, including the decisions of the bodies of the organisational unit involved. If a section issues an internal regulation, it must not be at variance with the regulations of CzMA JEP nor with the regulations of the organisational unit. The internal regulation of a section comes into force and effect upon its approval by the Board of Directors of CzMA JEP and upon registration at the Secretariat of CzMA JEP. The regulation is presented to the Board of Directors of CzMA JEP for approval together with the opinion of the organisational unit committee via the Secretariat of CzMA JEP.
- (4) An organisational unit of CzMA JEP shall have at least 50 regular members at the time of its foundation. An exception to this provision may be permitted by the Board of Directors of CzMA JEP.

- (5) The name of an organisational unit shall include the appellation “Czech Medical Association of Jan Evangelista Purkyně z.s.” or a corresponding language version, or the abbreviation “CzMA JEP z.s.” The Board of Directors of CzMA JEP may issue a regulation to determine the method and form in which organisational units of CzMA JEP act outward and inside CzMA JEP.
- (6) Organisational units may collaborate with similar professional societies and associations abroad or become their members.
- (7) In relation to exercising functions in the CzMA JEP bodies, reimbursements of travel and other eligible expenses may be paid. Details can be specified by the Board of Directors and the organisational unit Committee of CzMA JEP in the regulation on management.

§ 5

Bodies of organisational units

- (1) Organisational units of CzMA JEP have the following bodies:
 - a) Assembly of Members, or the Congress of Delegates (hereinafter referred to as the “Assembly of Members”)
 - b) Committee,
 - c) Audit Committee.
- (2) If sections are set up within an organisational unit, they establish the following bodies:
 - a) Section Member Meeting
 - b) Council or Committee of a section

§ 6

Assembly of Members of an organisational unit

- (1) The Assembly of Members is the highest body of an organisational unit.
- (2) The right to take part in an assembly of members is stipulated by the Rules of Procedure of CzMA JEP or alternatively the approved Rules of Procedure of the organisational unit.
- (3) The Assembly of Members is convened by the Committee of an organisational unit as needed, but at least once in four years. The conditions for convening the Assembly of Members are laid down by the Rules of Procedure of CzMA JEP or alternatively the Rules of Procedure of the organisational unit.
- (4) The Assembly of Members votes and dismisses:
 - a) the Committee of the organisational unit,

- b) the Audit Committee of the organisational unit
- c) and decides on their term of office, which lasts a maximum of 4 years.

The length of the term of office of the Committee and the Audit Committee shall be determined by the Rules of Procedure of CzMA JEP or alternatively the approved Rules of Procedure of the organisational unit.

- (5) The Assembly of Members has primarily the following authorisations:
- a) to approve, amend and cancel the regulations of the organisational unit,
 - b) to approve the decisions of the Committee on the division, merger or further internal structuring of the organisational unit and on the formation of its sections,
 - c) to approve the report on the activity over the previous period, the budget, the report of the Audit Committee and the basic lines of action of the organisational unit,
 - d) to decide on those matters of the organisational unit that are reserved for its decision.

§ 7

Committee of organisational unit

- (1) The Committee is the governing and executive body of the organisational unit.
- (2) The Committee of an organisational unit consists of at least three members. The composition of the Committee and frequency of its meetings are laid down by the Rules of Procedure of CzMA JEP or alternatively the approved Rules of Procedure of the organisational unit. Unless the number of the originally elected members falls below half, substitute members may be co-opted according to the election result.
- (3) As its main tasks, the Committee of an organisational unit:
- a) prepares meetings of the Assembly of Members, implements its resolutions and deals with ordinary agenda between meetings,
 - b) convenes the meetings of the Assembly of Members,
 - c) regularly informs its members and the Board of Directors of CzMA JEP on the activities of the organisational unit,
 - d) deals with issues related to the management of the organisational unit,
 - e) keeps records of its activities,
 - f) elaborates a report on its activities.
- (4) The Committee of an organisational unit has primarily the following powers:
- a) to elect from its midst the Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Scientific Secretary, Treasurer and other officials and to establish its advisory bodies, e.g. Working Groups and boards,

- b) in legitimate cases to delegate its representatives to the meetings of the relevant bodies of CzMA JEP and to authorise their acting on behalf of the organisational unit,
- c) to delegate organisational unit representatives to advisory bodies, boards and other bodies, as well as to any forms of proceedings related to issues involving the line of action of the organisational unit,
- d) to decide on further internal structuring of the organisational unit, e.g. on the establishment or abolition of its sections, including the composition of the Council or Committee of a section. To present these proposals for approval to the upcoming Assembly of Members,
- e) to establish other advisory bodies intended to perform short-term and long-term tasks,
- f) to decide on the formation of new/ termination of current membership in the organisational unit unless stated otherwise in the Articles of Association,
- g) to decide on the sum of the next membership fee – the organisational unit fee – and to present this decision for approval to the upcoming Assembly of Members,
- h) to approve the regulation laying down the prospective remuneration for activity in the organisational unit,
- i) to decide on the form of elections to the bodies of the organisational unit and to ensure their implementation in accordance with the Election Regulations of CzMA JEP or alternatively the approved Election Regulations of the organisational unit.
- j) to award or withdraw honorary membership in the organisational unit and to decide on the remission of duty to pay the organisational unit membership fee,
- k) to perform other activities assigned to the committee by the Assembly of Members of the organisational unit and to perform other activities related to the implementation of the mission statement and objectives of CzMA JEP (§ 2 and § 3 of the Articles of Association).

§ 8

Audit Committee of an organisational unit

- (1) The Audit committee is a control body of an organisational unit.
- (2) The Audit Committee of an organisational unit consists of at least three members. From their midst, the members elect the Chairman, who manages the Committee's work.
- (3) The Audit Committee of an organisational unit has primarily the following tasks:
 - a) to control the activity of the members and bodies of the organisational unit, including their sections,

- b) to write an audit report at least once a year.
- (4) The Audit Committee of an organisational unit has primarily the following authorizations:
 - a) to participate through its Chairman or an authorised member in the meetings of the bodies of the organisational unit upon its sole discretion,
 - b) to suspend decisions of the committee of an organisational unit if they are in conflict with laws, regulations of CzMA JEP or a relevant organisational unit and to present the suspended decisions to the committee for a new decision that shall be definitive in the matter being decided.
- (5) The Audit Committee of an organisational unit may request the convention of an Assembly of Members of the organisational unit pursuant to § 2 (5) of the Articles of Association.

§ 9

Bodies of CzMA JEP

CzMA JEP has the following bodies:

- a) Congress of Delegates, (which exercises the competence of the Member Meeting pursuant to §256, par. 1 of the Civil Code),
- b) Meeting of the Representatives of organisational units,
- c) Board of Directors,
- d) Audit Committee.

§ 10

Congress of Delegates of CzMA JEP

- (1) The Congress of Delegates of CzMA JEP (hereinafter referred to as “Congress of Delegates”) is the highest body of CzMA JEP. It is convened by the Board of Directors of CzMA JEP as needed but at least once in four years. The Board of Directors shall convene the Congress whenever at least 1/3 of organisational units requests so or if the Audit Committee of CzMA JEP requests so, within three months from the delivery of the request. The time, venue and programme of the Congress of Delegates shall be published by the Board of Directors of CzMA JEP at least thirty days prior the date of the Congress.
- (2) The representatives of individual organisational units are entitled to take part in the Congress of Delegates based on a key specified by the Board of Directors of CzMA JEP, which respects the proportional representation of their members.
- (3) The Congress of Delegates does primarily the following:

- a) approves, amends and cancels the Articles of Association, Rules of Procedure and Election Regulations of CzMA JEP or other regulations that are reserved for the decision of the Congress of Delegates,
- b) elects and dismisses the Board of Directors and the Audit Committee of CzMA JEP and decides on their term of office, which is usually 4 years,
- c) evaluates the activity of the bodies of CzMA JEP,
- d) approves the report on activities, the budget, the report of the Audit Committee and the basic lines of action of CzMA JEP,
- e) decides on matters that are reserved for decision of the Congress of Delegates.

§ 11

Meeting of Representatives of organisational units

- (1) The Meeting of Representatives of organisational units (hereinafter referred to as “Meeting of Representatives”) is convened during the period between Congresses of Delegates of CzMA JEP. The Meeting is convoked by the Board of Directors of CzMA JEP as needed. The Board of Directors is obliged to convene the Meeting whenever at least 1/2 of organisational units request so, within three months from the date of delivery of the request. The date, venue and programme of the Meeting of Representatives shall be published by the Board of Directors of CzMA JEP at least thirty days prior the date of the meeting.
- (2) The right to take part in the Meeting of Representatives is held by officials or representatives of particular organisational units with a written authorisation based on a key determined by the Board of Directors of CzMA JEP respecting the proportional representation of their members.
- (3) The Meeting of Representatives is authorised to adopt decisions on matters delegated to it based on its powers by the Board of Directors of CzMA JEP (e.g. to approve the establishment of new organisational units).
- (4) The Meeting of Representatives is authorised to adopt decisions on matters pertaining to the Congress of Delegates, except for:
 - a) approval of amendments and cancellation of the Articles of Association,
 - b) election and dismissal of members of the Board of Directors and the Audit Committee of CzMA JEP.

§ 12

Board of Directors of CzMA JEP

- (1) The Board of Directors of CzMA JEP is a statutory body.

- (2) The Board of Directors of CzMA JEP consists of at least fifteen members. It is convened by the Chairman, Vice-Chairman or another authorised member of the Board of Directors as needed, but at least ten times a year.
- (3) As its main tasks, the Board of Directors of CzMA JEP:
 - a) prepares meetings of the Congress of Delegates of CzMA JEP and Meetings of Representatives, implements their resolutions and deals with ordinary agenda between the meetings,
 - b) convenes the Congress of Delegates of CzMA JEP and Meetings of Representatives,
 - c) informs members through the bodies of CzMA JEP and bodies of organisational units on the activities of CzMA JEP,
 - d) manages the assets of CzMA JEP,
 - e) deals with the authorities of the Czech Republic and other organisations and institutions and delegates representatives of CzMA JEP to these meetings,
 - f) establishes and manages the activity of the Secretariat of CzMA JEP, decides on the staffing of its executive positions, defines the powers and responsibilities of the Director of the Secretariat and through the Secretariat deals with issues related to press, publishing, congress and other activities; the Secretariat handles the administrative agenda of CzMA JEP, in the framework of which it also co-operates in handling the agenda of CzMA JEP organizational units.
 - g) issues a regulation on the status and tasks of the CzMA JEP Secretariat, a regulation on the management of CzMA JEP and other regulations which it is authorised to issue on the basis of other provisions of these Articles of Association or on the basis of the authorisation issued by the Congress of Delegates,
 - h) approves regulations of organisational units of CzMA JEP,
 - i) performs other activities related to implementation of the mission statement and objectives of CzMA JEP (§ 2 and § 3 of the Articles of Association).
- (4) Furthermore, the Board of Directors of CzMA JEP has primarily the following powers:
 - a) to elect from its midst the Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Scientific Secretary, Treasurer and other officials and to establish its advisory bodies, e.g. the Working Groups and committees,
 - b) to establish funds and foundations of CzMA JEP and to manage them,
 - c) to decide on the establishment of new organisational units for time-limited period, i.e. up to the moment of approval by the Meeting of the Representatives of organisational units or the Congress of Delegates of CzMA JEP,
 - d) to decide on the dissolution of existing organisational units,
 - e) to conclude co-operation agreements,

- f) to send representatives with an advisory vote to the meetings of organisational units and their bodies,
- g) to establish international relations and secure their implementation; to represent CzMA JEP abroad,
- h) together with delegated representatives of organisational units to make lists of experts for the assessment of issues concerning healthcare,
- i) to establish working and advisory groups in order to perform short-term and long-term tasks, to determine their staffing and contents and to manage their activity,
- j) to decide on the sum of basic membership fees paid by members to the credit of CzMA JEP; to award or withdraw the honorary membership in CzMA JEP and to decide on the remission of the duty to pay the basic CzMA JEP membership fee,
- k) to decide on the method of voting to the bodies of CzMA JEP listed in § 9 Sections c) and d) of the Articles of Association and to ensure its implementation,
- l) to establish commercial or other companies, to delegate relevant experts – representatives of CzMA JEP thereto and to provide the representatives with a written authorisation specifying the extent thereof,
- m) to decide on the resolutions of the Chairman and Vice-Chairman that have been suspended by the Audit Committee of CzMA JEP.

§ 13

Chairman and Vice-Chairman of CzMA JEP

- (1) The Chairman represents CzMA JEP in the Czech Republic and abroad. He/she is authorised to sign any and all written documents on behalf of CzMA JEP and the Board of Directors of CzMA JEP. The Chairman signs instruments by adding “Chairman of the Czech Medical Association of Jan Evangelista Purkyně z.s.” to his/her name. In the event of the Chairman’s absence or busyness, he/she is represented by the Vice-Chairman or another authorised member of the bof CzMA JEP. They sign instruments by adding “Vice-Chairman of the Czech Medical Association of Jan Evangelista Purkyně z.s.” or “Authorised Member of the Board of directors of the Czech Medical Association of Jan Evangelista Purkyně” to their names.
- (2) The Chairman convenes and chairs meetings of the Board of Directors of CzMA JEP.
- (3) In the event of an urgent need the Chairman is authorised to make the necessary decisions comprised in the competences of the Board of Directors of CzMA JEP. The Chairman shall immediately notify the Board of Directors of such decisions.
- (4) The Chairman presents a report on the activities for the past period to the Congress of delegates of CzMA JEP.

§ 14

Audit Committee of CzMA JEP

- (1) The Audit Committee of CzMA JEP is the highest control body of CzMA JEP.
- (2) The Audit Committee of CzMA JEP consists of at least five members. The Audit Committee elects from its midst the Chairman, who will manage its activities.
- (3) The Audit Committee of CzMA JEP has primarily the following powers:
 - a) through its Chairman or Vice-Chairman or other authorised members to take part in meetings of the bodies of CzMA JEP and its organisational units at its discretion,
 - b) to suspend the execution of a decision of the Chairman or Vice-Chairman if the decision is in conflict with the legal regulations or the Articles of Association and other regulations of CzMA JEP, and to present the suspended decisions to the upcoming meeting of the Board of Directors of CzMA JEP,
 - c) to suspend the execution of a decision of the Board of Directors if the decision is in conflict with regulations or the Articles of Association and other regulations of CzMA JEP, and present the suspended decisions to the Board of Directors for a new decision that shall be final in the adjudicated matter,
 - d) To suspend the execution of a decision of the Assembly of Members of an organisational unit if the decision is in conflict with regulations or the Articles of Association and other regulations of CzMA JEP, and to present the suspended decisions to the Assembly of Members of an organisational unit for a new decision that shall be final in the adjudicated matter.
- (4) The Audit Committee of CzMA JEP may request convocation of a Congress of Delegates pursuant to § 10 (1) of the Articles of Association.
- (5) When deciding on the establishment of a commercial or another company pursuant to § 12 (4) 1) the presence of the Chairman of the Audit Committee is mandatory. In the event of the suspension of a decision regarding this matter, the Audit Committee may adopt the final decision only by means of a Congress of Delegates.
- (6) In extraordinary cases (e.g. non-functioning Committee, breach of the Articles of Association) the Audit Committee is authorised to organise a new election to the bodies of the organisational units.

CHAPTER THREE

Basic provisions on membership

§ 15

Forms of membership

Membership in CzMA JEP is regular, honorary, associated and professional.

§ 16

Regular membership

- (1) Any physician, pharmacist or another employee in healthcare and affiliated fields or a university student preparing for the aforementioned professions may become a regular member of CzMA JEP if he/she accepts the mission statement and objectives of CzMA JEP and commits to contribute to their performance.
- (2) Any regular member of some of the organisational units of CzMA JEP is a regular member of CzMA JEP. The number of organisational units the person may be a member of is not limited.
- (3) Regular membership in CzMA JEP is formed by the approval of a written (electronic) application of a candidate for regular membership by the Committee of the relevant organisational unit after payment of the basic membership fee and another membership fee, which is payable to the relevant organisational unit.
- (4) Any regular membership in CzMA JEP expires upon:
 - a) death of a member,
 - b) withdrawal based on a written declaration; the withdrawal is effective on the date of delivery of the withdrawal,
 - c) cessation of an organisational unit unless the organisational unit has a successor where the regular member performs an activity unless he/she is concurrently registered in another organisational unit,
 - d) expulsion, especially due to the failure to perform membership duties (the termination shall be executed by the body of the organisational unit). If the member is in default with payment of the membership fee by more than 12 months, the Board of Directors of CzMA JEP or an organisational unit may decide on the termination of the membership provided that the member was notified in writing on the correspondence or e-mail address provided to CzMA JEP. Within fifteen days from the delivery of the decision, the member may propose in writing that the decision on his/her expulsion should be reviewed by a review board.

- e) The records and deletions of members are made by the Secretariat of CzMA JEP on the initiative of organizational units. The list of organizational unit members shall be made accessible upon the request of the designated member of the organizational unit, who will sign a declaration on the protection of personal data use.

§ 17

Rights of a regular member

Any regular member of CzMA JEP has the following rights:

- a) to participate in activities of the relevant organisational units of CzMA JEP,
- b) to elect representatives to the bodies of the relevant organisational units and to be elected,
- c) be informed of activities of CzMA JEP and the relevant organisational units,
- d) to address his/her requirements, proposals and complaints to the bodies of CzMA JEP and the bodies of the relevant organisational units, to express freely his/her opinions, suggestions and comments concerning the activities thereof,
- e) to use the help and support of CzMA JEP and relevant organisational units in activities arising from the mission statement and objectives of CzMA JEP.

§ 18

Duties of a regular member

(1) Any regular member of CzMA JEP shall:

- a) adhere to the regulations of CzMA JEP and the relevant organisational unit,
- b) contribute to the fulfilment of the mission statement and objectives of CzMA JEP,
- c) provide the bodies and officials of CzMA JEP with the necessary collaboration and do nothing that might be in conflict with the interests and reputation of CzMA JEP and its organisational units,
- d) pay the required membership fees in due time,
- e) perform the entrusted tasks with due care.

(2) Members of CzMA JEP, especially persons holding offices in the bodies of CzMA JEP may not act in conflict with the interests of CzMA JEP. If there is a conflict of interests during the performance of an office, the person performing the office is not authorized to act on behalf of CzMA JEP. If this

principle is breached, the Board of Directors of CzMA JEP may decide to dismiss the person from his/her office, and in serious cases even to expel him/her from CzMA JEP (e.g. if the member causes major economic damage). If this principle is breached by a member of the Board of Directors of CzMA JEP, such a decision may be adopted by the Audit Committee of CzMA JEP (§ 14 of the Articles of Association).

§ 19

Honorary membership, honorary offices

- (1) A person having exceptional merits in the development of the medical science and healthcare, or the development of CzMA JEP or any of its organisational units, may become an honorary member of CzMA JEP or any of its organisational units.
- (2) The awarding of honorary membership in CzMA JEP is decided upon by the Board of Directors on the basis of a proposal made primarily by the organisational units. The awarding of honorary membership in the organisational unit is decided upon by the Committee of the relevant organisational unit. The body which has awarded the honorary membership may relieve its holder of the duty to pay membership fees to the relevant organisational unit. Honorary membership may also be awarded to a non-member of CzMA JEP.
- (3) A honorary member has the same rights and duties as a regular member. Unless a honorary member is simultaneously a regular member of CzMA JEP, he/she does not have the right to vote, his/her vote is only advisory. He/she may neither vote nor be elected, and he/she does not pay membership fees.
- (4) In serious cases (e.g. in damaging the reputation of CzMA JEP), the honorary membership in CzMA JEP or its organisational unit may be withdrawn. Honorary membership in CzMA JEP or its organisational unit may be surrendered by means of a written announcement to the body which has awarded the honorary membership.
- (5) On the basis of the previous long-term performance of an office in CzMA JEP, the person involved may be commissioned to perform of a honorary office in CzMA JEP or its organisational unit. The person commissioned to perform the honorary office is entitled to participate in the meetings of the body of which he/she is a honorary member, with an advisory vote.
- (6) The Board of Directors of CzMA JEP or the Committee of an organisational unit may regulate other details related to regular membership, awarding of honorary membership and commissioning to perform a honorary office.

§ 20

Associated membership

- (1) The Board of Directors or an organisational unit may decide on the establishment of associated membership for legal entities.
- (2) The decision shall subsequently be presented by the committee of the organisational unit for approval to the Board of Directors of CzMA JEP and for registration to the Secretariat.
- (3) An associated member has no voting right and may neither vote nor be elected to the bodies of CzMA JEP.
- (4) Membership conditions must be agreed in writing, including the amounts of payment of membership fees and other provisions.

§ 20 a

Professional membership

- (1) The Committee of an organisational unit may decide to establish a professional membership (e.g. nurses, laboratory technicians, etc.). The conditions of membership, the rights and obligations of the professional members, including the right to decide and the right to vote and be voted for, shall be regulated in the articles of association of the respective organisational unit.
- (2) Previously established professional memberships in organizational units must be incorporated into the articles of association of the respective organisational units, registered in the membership records of CzMA JEP, and submitted to the Board of Directors of CzMA JEP for approval by 31 December 2023. If not done, the previously established professional memberships of the members of the respective organisational unit shall cease on that date.

§ 21

Agreements on co-operation

Under conditions stipulated in generally binding legal regulations, CzMA JEP may conclude agreements on co-operation with third parties. The agreement must be concluded in writing and must define in particular the purpose of the co-operation, the manner of its performance, the rights and duties of contracting parties and the means by which the participants contribute to the co-operation. The specific agreement type shall be selected according to the contents of the agreement.

CHAPTER FOUR

Assets and management

§ 22

Administration of assets and management

- (1) CzMA JEP independently administers its assets and manages based on an annual budget.
- (2) The proceeds of CzMA JEP consist of:
 - a) membership fees,
 - b) subsidies and gifts,
 - c) other proceeds, e.g. revenues from events and activities of business companies of which CzMA JEP is the founder or in whose activities CzMA JEP takes part.
- (3) The assets are intended for the fulfilment of tasks specified in the Articles of Association of CzMA JEP.
- (4) Management of CzMA JEP and its organisational units is governed by generally binding legal regulations and regulations issued for this purpose by the Board of Directors of CzMA JEP.

CHAPTER FIVE

§ 23

Cessation of CzMA JEP and its organisational units

- (1) CzMA JEP ceases upon voluntary dissolution or merger with another civic association.
- (2) The cessation of CzMA JEP is adjudicated by the Congress of Delegates of CzMA JEP.
- (3) In the event of the cessation of CzMA JEP, the Congress of Delegates shall appoint a liquidating group to administer the property settlement.

§ 24

Cessation of an organisational unit

- (1) An organisational unit ceases upon:

- a) voluntary dissolution, division, merger or fusion,
 - b) decision on cessation if the activity of an organisational unit is in conflict with generally binding legal regulations or regulations of CzMA JEP, the expert or another activity of an organisational unit damages the reputation of CzMA JEP or another organisational unit, its activity is in conflict with the mission statement or objectives of CzMA JEP or due to other serious reasons.
- (2) Cessation of an organisational unit is resolved by:
- a) Assembly of Members of the organisational unit in cases stated in § 24 (1) a) of the Articles of Association. In the event of merger or fusion, the cessation shall be decided by assemblies of members of the relevant organisational units; in order to come into force and effect, such a decision requires the approval by the Board of Directors of CzMA JEP and the registration in the Secretariat.
 - b) Board of Directors of CzMA JEP in case stated in § 23 (1) b) of the Articles of Association.
- (3) In the event of the cessation of an organisational unit, the Board of Directors of CzMA JEP shall appoint a commission to resolve property matters together with the Secretariat of CzMA JEP.

CHAPTER SIX

Temporary and final provisions

§ 25

- (1) The bodies of CzMA JEP, the bodies of organisational units and the competent officials shall amend the previously issued regulations and directives no later than within 12 months from the date of approval of these Articles of Association CzMA JEP in such a manner that is not conflict with these Articles of Association.
- (2) The Articles of Association approved by an extraordinary Congress of Delegates of CzMA JEP on 11 November 1992 and amended by the Congress of Delegates of CzMA JEP on 7 December 1994, 20 November 1996, 31 January 2003, 7 November 2011, and 28 January 2015 shall expire.
- (3) These Articles of Association were approved by the Congress of Delegates of CzMA JEP on 19 January 2023.

RULES OF PROCEDURE

CHAPTER ONE

General provisions

§ 1

Starting points and competence

- (1) The Rules of Procedure of the Czech Medical Association of Jan Evangelista Purkyně z.s. (hereinafter referred to as “CzMA JEP”) follow the relevant provisions of the Articles of Association of CzMA JEP (hereinafter referred to as “Articles of Association”).
- (2) The Rules of Procedure of CzMA JEP (hereinafter referred to as “Rules of Procedure”) govern the meetings of the following bodies of CzMA JEP:
 - a) on the level of the central bodies of CzMA JEP
 - Congress of Delegates (see § 10 of the Articles of Association),
 - Meeting of Representatives (see § 11 of the Articles of Association),
 - Board of Directors (see § 12 of the Articles of Association),
 - Audit Committee (see § 14 of the Articles of Association).
 - b) on the level of an organisational unit of CzMA JEP
 - Assembly of Members (see § 6 of the Articles of Association),
 - Committee (see § 7 of the Articles of Association),
 - Audit Committee (see § 8 of the Articles of Association),
 - c) on the level of a section of CzMA JEP
 - Section Member Meeting (see § 5 of the Articles of Association)
 - Council or Committee of a section (see § 5 of the Articles of Association).
- (3) For meetings of other bodies of CzMA JEP and its organisational units the particular provisions of this regulation shall be used adequately.
- (4) The organisational unit is entitled to elaborate its own Rules of Procedure, whose principles are in accordance with the regulations of CzMA JEP. The Rules of Procedure of an organisational unit become valid upon their approval by the Board of Directors of CzMA JEP.
- (5) The bodies of the CzMA JEP and its organizational units may meet and decide via any of the following forms:
 - a) a meeting,
 - b) a remote meeting (electronically),

c) a combination of a meetings and a remote meeting.

If the body decides without discussing the matter, it may also decide by per rollam voting. The form of the body's meeting shall be decided by the convener.

CHAPTER TWO

Common provisions

§ 2

Presence at meetings and the right to vote

- (1) Members with the right to participate take part in meetings of the bodies of CzMA JEP stated in § 1 (2) of the Rules of Procedure unless they have serious reasons not to participate.
- (2) Regular and honorary members (members of CzMA JEP) have the right to participate in meeting of a body; members of a superior body may do so for an inferior body. Participation of members of the Audit Committee in meetings of other bodies is governed by relevant provisions of the Articles of Association.
- (3) Guests may take part in meetings of a body only with an approval of a working Board of Directors. If a working Board of Directors is not elected, guests may participate in the meetings of a body upon the approval of a person chairing the body or upon the approval of the majority of members of the body.
- (4) Regular members have the right to vote during the meeting of a body; honorary members have an advisory vote. Transfer of the right to vote to another member is inadmissible.
- (5) The assembly of members of an organisational unit must be convoked whenever at least 1/5 of its members request so, or if the Audit Committee requests so, within three months from the date of delivery of the request. In the event of the non-functionality of a Committee, the Assembly of Members is convoked by the Audit Committee of CzMA JEP.
- (6) The Committee of the organisational unit is obliged to publish the date and venue of the Assembly of Members at least 15 days before the Assembly is held.

§ 3

Quorum

- (1) The meeting of a body can be initiated at the announced time and the body can decide by resolution if an absolute majority of members with a right to vote are present.

- (2) If the meeting of bodies stated in § 5 a) of the Articles of Association and in § 9 a) and b) of the Articles of Association is not attended by a quorum, the present members shall wait for 10 minutes from the announced start of the meeting. After the lapse of the time, the meeting may be initiated and declared as having a quorum. In such case a resolution of the body is valid if an absolute majority of the present members with the right to vote have voted for the resolution. The meeting may be initiated and declared as having a quorum if at least 1/10 of members with the right to vote are present.
- (3) The provision in § 3 (2) of the Rules of Procedure is applicable only if it is possible to plausibly prove that all members of the body were notified of the date and venue of the meeting.
- (4) In the event of distance (per rollam) voting, the resolution is adopted if at least one half of all members of the relevant body have voted for the proposal.

§ 4

Meeting programme

- (1) The meeting of a body is convoked by the Chairman, Vice-Chairman or another authorized member of the body. The composition of a body may be laid down by a regulation of the organisational unit.
- (2) The meeting of a body is governed by a programme approved by the meeting participants in the introduction. If serious reasons so require, an amended programme may be decided by voting during the meeting.
- (3) The programme of the meeting shall include a report on the activities of the body for the previous period and an audit of the fulfilment of previously adopted resolutions and tasks if the meeting of an assembly of members or congress of delegates is involved.
- (4) If the body receives a notice of the relevant Audit Committee that its resolution is in conflict with law or some regulation of CzMA JEP in force, the body is obliged to discuss the resolution at the upcoming meeting in the presence of an authorised member of the Audit Committee.

§ 5

Moderation and course of meeting

- (1) A member of the body authorised to moderate its meeting presents a proposal to close individual items of the agenda, suggests voting, moderates discussion and proposes the termination of the meeting.
- (2) Discussion is usually part of the individual items of the agenda. All members of the body and non-members with the right to participate may take part in the discussion (see § 2 (2) of the Rules of Procedure). Guests

may take part in the discussion only upon the approval of the person authorised to moderate the meeting.

§ 6

Voting

- (1) Any regular member of the body has a right to present a proposal for voting.
- (2) Unless otherwise stipulated, particular proposals are voted by public voting in a reversed order to that in which they had been presented. Amending proposals are voted first. A request for secret voting is voted by the participants of the meeting in a public voting.
- (3) In case of parity of votes the decisive vote is that of the Chairman; in the Chairman's absence, the decisive vote is that of his/her deputy.

§ 7

Resolution

- (1) Members of CzMA JEP are obliged to comply with the resolutions of the CzMA JEP bodies.
- (2) The resolution of the CzMA JEP bodies is made public on the website of CzMA JEP or of the organisational units or is published in materials issued by CzMA JEP bodies. Information on where the resolution is published is communicated to the Board of Directors and Committees of organisational units.

CHAPTER THREE

Meetings of the bodies of CzMA JEP

§ 8

Meeting of the Assembly of Members of an organisational unit

- (1) The convocation of an Assembly of Members of an organisational unit (hereinafter referred to as "Assembly of Members") is laid down in § 6 (3) of the Articles of Association.
- (2) Meetings of Assemblies of Members are governed by the common provisions stated in §§ 2-7 of the Rules of Procedure.

§ 9

- (1) Regular members of an organisational unit may request the discussion of their materials at a meeting of the Assembly of Members. In such a case they should deliver the materials to the Committee of the organisational unit no later than 1 month prior to the date of the meeting. Materials delivered late may be included in the agenda only if there is an urgent need to discuss them after lapse of time for delivery thereof.
- (2) Any and all written materials determined for discussion at the Assembly of Members shall be delivered by the Committee of the organisational unit to the participants no later than ten days prior the date of the Assembly. After that date, written materials may only be sent if there is an urgent need to discuss them after lapse of time for delivery thereof. Materials may be sent out in a written form or published on the website, in which case members shall be demonstrably informed of such publication.

§ 10

- (1) Until a working Board of Directors is appointed, the meeting of an Assembly of Members shall be initiated and moderated by an authorised member of the Committee of an organisational unit.
- (2) After the meeting is opened, the authorised member of the Committee of an organisational unit states whether the Assembly of Members has a quorum pursuant to § 3 of the Rules of Procedure. If this condition is met, the participants of the meeting having the right to vote shall elect a working Board of Directors and a Proposal and Mandate Committee, and they shall approve of the agenda of the meeting. The Election Commission is elected if the programme agenda includes the election of bodies or their members.
 - a) The working Board of Directors moderates the meeting of an Assembly of Members.
 - b) The Mandate Committee checks the presence of participants of the meeting and verifies the legitimacy of their participation in the meeting and voting.
 - c) The Proposal Committee prepares a proposal of a resolution, incorporates comments and suggestions of the participants in the meeting and processes the final version.
 - d) The activity of the Election Commission is regulated by relevant provisions of the Election Regulations of CzMA JEP.

§ 11

A resolution must be adopted from the meeting of the Assembly of Members. The resolution may be adopted concerning a relevant item of the agenda immediately after the discussion thereof or aggregately at the conclusion of the meeting.

§ 12

The provisions of the Rules of Procedure shall also be used adequately for the agenda of the Section Member Meeting and of the Council or Committee of a section.

§ 13

Meeting of the Congress of Delegates and Meeting of Representatives

- (1) Convocation of the Congress of Delegates and Meeting of Representatives is laid down by § 10 (1) and § 11 (1) of the Articles of Association.
- (2) Meetings of the Congress of Delegates and Meetings of Representatives are governed by the common provisions stated in §§ 2-7 of the Rules of Procedure.
- (3) For meetings of the Congress of Delegates and Meetings of Representatives, the provisions of §§ 8-11 of the Rules of Procedure shall be used adequately.

§ 14

Meetings of other bodies

- (1) For the purposes of this regulation, other bodies (hereinafter referred to as “bodies”) of CzMA JEP and its organisational units are all bodies specified in § 1 (2) of the Rules of Procedure except for the Assembly of Members, Congress of Delegates and Meeting of Representatives.
- (2) Meetings of the bodies are governed by the common provisions stated in §§ 2-7 of the Rules of Procedure.

§ 15

- (1) A meeting of a body is convoked and chaired by the Chairman, Vice-Chairman or another authorised member of the body.
- (2) Unless the date of the meeting of a body was determined at the previous meeting, it is convoked in writing or in another form previously agreed upon by the members of the body.
- (3) The meeting of a body shall be convoked whenever at least 1/4 of its members request so in writing; the meeting shall be held within thirty days from the date of delivery of the written request.

§ 16

- (1) The Chairman or Vice-Chairman shall be required to report on their activities since the last meeting of the body at the opening of the body's meeting.
- (2) Minutes of the body's meeting shall be taken and made available to each of its members. The minutes of the body's meetings shall be delivered to the appropriate review committee; the minutes of the review committee's meeting shall be delivered to the relevant body.
- (3) Minutes of the meeting of the Committee are made available to members of the organisational unit for inspection with a designated member of the committee of an organisational unit. Minutes of meetings of the Board of Directors of CzMA JEP must be made available for inspection at the Secretariat of CzMA JEP.

CHAPTER FOUR

Final provisions

§ 17

Effect

- (1) The Rules of Procedure approved by an extraordinary Congress of the Delegates of CzMA JEP on 7 December 2011 are herewith annulled.
- (2) These Rules of Procedure come into force and effect on 17 May 2022.

ELECTION REGULATIONS

§ 1

Starting points and competence

- (1) The Election Regulations of the Czech Medical Association of Jan Evangelista Purkyně z.s. (hereinafter referred to as “CzMA JEP”) follow the relevant provisions of the Articles of Association of CzMA JEP (hereinafter referred to as “Articles of Association”).
- (2) The Election Regulations of CzMA JEP (hereinafter referred to as “Election Regulations”) regulate elections to permanent and working offices within CzMA JEP.
- (3) An organisational unit is entitled to elaborate its own Election Regulations, whose principles are in accordance with the regulations of CzMA JEP. The Election Regulations of an organisational units become valid upon their approval by the Board of Directors of CzMA JEP.

§ 2

Elected bodies and offices

- (1) The Assembly of Members of an organisational unit (§ 6 of the Articles of Association) elects the following permanent bodies:
 - Committee composed of three and more members (§ 7 of the Articles of Association),
 - Audit Committee composed of three and more members (§ 8 of the Articles of Association).
- (2) If a section is established, its Section Member Meeting elects:
 - Council or Committee of the section.
- (3) The Congress of Delegates of CzMA JEP (§ 10 of the Articles of Association) elects the following permanent bodies:
 - Board of Directors composed of fifteen and more members (§ 12 of the Articles of Association),
 - Audit Committee composed of five and more members (§ 14 of the Articles of Association).
- (4) The Assembly of Members of an organisational unit, the Meeting of Representatives and the Congress of Delegates of CzMA JEP elect the following working bodies:
 - working Board of Directors composed of five and more members,
 - Election Commission composed of three and more members in case there is an election on the agenda of the meeting,

- Mandate Committee composed of three and more members,
- Proposal Committee composed of three and more members,
- other working bodies upon their discretion.

A Member Meeting adequately elects working bodies as needed.

- (5) Members of the Committee of an organisational unit and members of the Board of Directors of CzMA JEP elect a Chairman, Vice-Chairman and other officials from their midst. Members of the Audit Committee of an organisational unit and members of the Audit Committee of CzMA JEP elect a Chairman from their midst.
- (6) Members of working bodies elect a Chairman from their midst.

§ 3

Limited performance of an office

- (1) The term of office of the permanent bodies and offices in CzMA JEP and its organisational units is no more than four years.
- (2) A member of the Audit Committee of CzMA JEP may not concurrently be a member of the Board of Directors of CzMA JEP; a member of the Audit Committee of an organisational unit may not concurrently be a member of the Committee of the same organisational unit.

§ 4

Right to vote

- (1) Regular members have the right to vote in the elections to the bodies of an organisational unit of CzMA JEP.
- (2) Delegates of the Congress of CzMA JEP have the right to vote in the elections to the bodies of CzMA JEP. Delegates of the Congress may only include regular members.
- (3) The right to vote of regular members of CzMA JEP is equal and direct or equal and indirect.

§ 5

Forms of voting and validity

- (1) The election to the Committee of an organisational unit, Audit Committee of an organisational unit, the Board of Directors of CzMA JEP and the Audit Committee of CzMA JEP shall be done by voting by a secret ballot. The election to other bodies may be done by voting by secret ballot or by public voting based on the decision of participants having the right to vote (hereinafter referred to as “qualified voters”).

- (2) The provision of § 3 of the Rules of Procedure applies for the validity of an election. A set number of persons who have received most of the votes are elected as members of bodies. If several candidates in the last elected position received the same number of votes, the election shall be resolved by drawing lots in the presence of the Election Commission.

If, as a result of an election, a situation described in § 3(2) of the Electoral Regulations arises, the elected member must notify the Chairman of the Election Commission within 3 weeks of the election which office s/he will hold. If s/he fails to do so, s/he shall be deemed to have resigned from both bodies. Officials are elected if they received the simple majority of votes of the qualified voters.

§ 6

Preparation of election

- (1) Individuals or groups from among regular members of CzMA JEP may conduct an election campaign. Within the campaign, candidates may be proposed for the elected bodies and offices.
- (2) The election campaign shall be conducted in accordance with generally binding legal regulations, by the spirit of generally accepted ethical principles and in line with the requirements for a democratic and free course of an election.
- (3) The election campaign is usually initiated 3 months prior to the election.
- (4) The Committee of an organisational unit, the Council or Committee of a section and the Board of Directors of CzMA JEP draw up and publish candidate lists; this does not apply in the case of electronic and combined voting (see § 7 (1) of the Election Regulations). They shall ensure all conditions for the successful course of the election. They shall also set the numbers of elected members of the bodies in cases where the numbers are not fixed.
- (5) Candidate lists are separately drawn up for elections to the Committee of an organisational unit, the Board of Directors of CzMA JEP and the Council or Committee of a section and separately for the Audit Committee of an organisational unit and the Audit Committee of CzMA JEP.

§ 7

Election Commission

- (1) An Election Commission conducts and organizes the election, draws up candidate lists in the case of electronic and combined voting, counts valid and invalid votes and announces election results. The Election Commission is liable for the right course of the election and resolves complaints, if any. Its members simultaneously fulfill the office of scrutineers.

- (2) Members of the Election Commission are elected one by one. Membership in the Election Commission is incompatible with candidacy for permanent bodies (Committee and the Audit Committee of an organisational unit, Council or Committee of a section and the Board of Directors and Audit Committee of CzMA JEP).
- (3) A decision of the Election Commission is valid if an absolute majority of votes has declared for it.

§ 8

Methods of election to permanent bodies and the course thereof

- (1) Elections to permanent bodies are usually conducted in a one-round manner.
- (2) A two-round method may be decided upon by the body which called the election.
- (3) The results of the election shall be publicly announced by the Election Commission immediately after the results are known but no later than two weeks after the end of the election.
- (4) The Chairman or another Election Commission member authorized by the Chairman conducts the elections of officials of permanent bodies.
- (5) The Election Commission shall make minutes about the course and results of the election; the minutes must be signed by all members of the Election Commission. The reasons for a potential refusal to sign the minutes shall be noted down. The election result is stated in the resolution from the meeting of the permanent body.
- (6) Complaints about the course of the election can be submitted in writing within one month from the announcement of the results to the address of the Election Commission. Complaints submitted later shall not be given consideration. The complaint shall be decided upon by the Election Commission.

§ 9

Methods of election to working bodies and the course thereof

The provisions of this regulation apply to the method and course of the election to the working bodies of CzMA JEP and its organisational units. The specific form of the election is decided by relevant bodies with a view to ensuring the free and democratic course of the election.

§ 10

Electronic and combined voting

- (1) Elections to the Committee and Audit Committee of an organisational unit and to the Council or Committee of a section may be conducted in an electronic or combined manner.
- (2) The form and manner of voting is decided upon by the Committee of an organisational unit and Council or Committee of a section. The Committee of an organizational unit may also decide, when announcing the election, that the Committee will be structured (e.g. in terms of the exercise of the medical profession) and set the conditions related to this.
- (3) When conducting the determined form of voting, all qualified voters shall have been provably summoned.
- (4) The Committee of the organisational unit and Council or Committee of a section shall appoint an Election Commission pursuant to § 7.
- (5) Elections are prepared in accordance with § 6.
- (6) The Election Commission shall ensure the preparation of ballots, which shall have been demonstrably sent to all qualified voters.
- (7) Other provisions of the Election Regulations shall be used adequately for the determined period.
- (8) The Board of directors of CzMA JEP may set more detailed conditions for organizing electronic elections. The specific manner of conducting electronic voting shall be determined in advance by the Committee of an organisational unit and the Council or Committee of a section. An electronic election must ensure the provability of the vote. Prior to the implementation of an electronic election, it is necessary to agree with the Secretariat of CzMA JEP on the specific course of the election, especially securing the secret ballot.

§ 11

Effect

- (1) The Election Regulations of CzMA JEP approved by an extraordinary Congress of Delegates on 7 December 2011 are herewith annulled.
- (2) These Election Regulations come into force and effect on 17 May 2022.
